SCREENING EVENT: "DEAR CORKY"

Curtis Chin's documentary film

For over fifty years, New York native Corky Lee photographed his hometown's Chinatown, and Asian American communities around the country. With a strong sense of social justice, he captured activists, celebrities, and everyday heroes with equal passion, taking over a hundred thousand photos. Sadly, while documenting the latest rise of anti-Asian hate crimes, Corky fell to COVID. Through his own words and pictures, *Dear Corky* reveals the man behind the camera. The screening is followed by a discussion between Mr. Chin and Dr. Jacqueline Barrios. Dr. Barrios is a Professor of Public and Applied Humanities, teaches in the new Asian Pacific American Studies minor program, and is a Faculty-in-Residence with the Asian Pacific American Student Affairs (APASA).
